**A tribute to Grandmaster Yang Zhenduo

Call for contributions

November 7, 2021 is the first anniversary of the death of Grandmaster Yang Zhenduo, the fourth generation descendant of Yang Family Tai Chi Chuan.

The following is the official request for submissions.

1. Purpose of the album

Through various forms of expression, the collection of items in the album will evoke the great master's spirit and exquisite style, reflect upon his outstanding lifelong contribution to the promotion of tai chi chuan, and look forward to the future of Yang Family Tai Chi Chuan

2. Scope of the Call for Contributions

Yang Family Tai Chi centers, schools, disciples, instructors, members, and all other Yang Family Tai Chi Chuan practitioners, and enthusiasts.

3. Forms of submissions and requirements

- Original poems and essays, with any subject matter and word count, accompanied by a recent photograph of the author.
- Photographs: clear black-and-white and/or colour photos accompanied by an explanation of the photograph and a brief description of the author.
- Painting and calligraphy: any format, with text of the body of the work and a brief description of the author.
- Video: Solo or group practice of Yang Family Tai Chi Chuan hand and/or weapon forms with music, not exceeding 5 minutes in length, filmed in 1080P landscape format.
